Scleroderma is believed to be an autoimmune disease. This means that it occurs in part because the body's immune system begins to attack the connective tissues. In 15 to 20 percent of cases, a person who has scleroderma also has symptoms of another autoimmune disease, such as rheumatoid arthritis, lupus or Sjogren's syndrome.

Systemic sclerosis can affect many body parts, from skin and blood vessels to organs, muscles, and joints. Symptoms depend on the type you have. They can include: Calcium lumps under your skin. Digestive trouble. Dry mouth, eyes, skin, or vagina. Heart, kidney, or lung problems. Stiff, swollen, warm, or tender joints.

Scleroderma is a less common form of arthritis, even less common than rheumatoid arthritis, and involves skin hardening and random swelling and scarring of the skin. Scleroderma also involves blood vessel disease due to chronic inflammation within the blood vessels. There is no known cause of scleroderma, which makes it a difficult disease to cure, but it is usually treated the same way as rheumatoid arthritis.

What is the Relationship Between Scleroderma and ...

Although there is no firm definition of scleroderma overlap syndrome to date, whenever a patient fulfills the diagnostic criteria of at least two CTD or clinical manifestations of other CTDs are significantly greater than usually found in scleroderma, it is termed scleroderma overlap syndrome. 1 Occurrence of CTD, like rheumatoid arthritis (RA), systemic lupus erythematosus (SLE), polymyositis (PM) and primary Sjögren's syndrome (pSS), can coexist, precede or follow the onset of scleroderma.
